A Comparative History of Literatures in the Iberian Peninsula is the second comparative history of a new subseries with a regional focus, published by the Coordinating Committee of the International Comparative Literature Association. As its predecessor for East-Central Europe, this two-volume history distances itself from traditional histories built around periods and movements, and explores, from a comparative viewpoint, a space considered to be a powerful symbol of inter-literary relations. Both the geographical pertinence and its symbolic condition are obviously discussed, when not even contested. Written by an international team of researchers who are specialists in the field, this history is the first attempt at applying a comparative approach to the plurilingual and multicultural literatures in the Iberian Peninsula. The aim of comprehensiveness is abandoned in favor of a diverse and extensive array of key issues for a comparative agenda. A Comparative History of Literatures in the Iberian Peninsula undermines the primacy claimed for national and linguistic boundaries, and provides a geo-cultural account of literary inter-systems which cannot otherwise be explained.

James Clerk Maxwell (1831-1879) had a relatively brief, but remarkable life, lived in his beloved rural home of Glenlair, and variously in Edinburgh, Aberdeen, London and Cambridge. His scholarship also ranged wide - covering all the major aspects of Victorian natural philosophy. He was one of the most important mathematical physicists of all time, coming only after Newton and Einstein. In scientific terms his immortality is enshrined in electromagnetism and Maxwell's equations, but as this book shows, there was much more to Maxwell than electromagnetism, both in terms of his science and his wider life. Maxwell's life and contributions to science are so rich that they demand the expertise of a range of academics - physicists, mathematicians, and historians of science and literature - to do him justice. The various chapters will enable Maxwell to be seen from a range of perspectives. Chapters 1 to 4 deal with wider aspects of his life in

time and place, at Aberdeen, King's College London and the Cavendish Laboratory. Chapters 5 to 12 go on to look in more detail at his wide ranging contributions to science: optics and colour, the dynamics of the rings of Saturn, kinetic theory, thermodynamics, electricity, magnetism and electromagnetism with the concluding chapters on Maxwell's poetry and Christian faith.

Elizabeth Siddal (1829-1862), poetessa, pittrice e modella, si lasciò alle spalle la miseria degli slum di Southwark per diventare uno dei volti più celebri dell'Inghilterra vittoriana. Oggi, anche coloro che ignorano il suo nome ne riconoscono i delicati lineamenti nella fragile Ofelia di John Everett Millais e nella serafica Beata Beatrix di Dante Gabriel Rossetti, due dei quadri più celebri dell'Ottocento. nata morta e dai tradimenti del marito, la Siddal si tolse la vita poco prima di compiere 33 anni. La toccante ma vivace biografia di Lucinda Hawksley riesce finalmente a sottrarre questa indimenticabile figura di donna dall'ombra di Rossetti, portandola alla luce e all'attenzione che merita. Lizzie Siddal fu infatti anche una poetessa e artista talentuosa, descritta dallo scrittore e critico John Ruskin come un genio equiparabile a pittori del calibro di J.M.W. Turner e G.F. Watts. La sua è una storia appassionante e tormentata, facilmente accostabile allo spietato mondo contemporaneo dell'arte, della moda e della bellezza.
