A mother recounts her life story to her long-lost daughter in this sweeping historical novel about a community torn between Italian fascism and German Nazism. In the small village of Curon in South Tyrol, seventeen-year-old Trina longs for a different life. She dedicates herself to becoming a teacher, but the year that she qualifies—1923—Mussolini's regime abolishes the use of German as a teaching language in the annexed Austrian territory. Defying their ruthless program of forced Italianization, Trina works for a clandestine network of schools in the valley, always with the risk of capture. In spite of this new climate of fear and uncertainty, she finds love and some measure of stability with Erich, an orphaned young man and her father's helper. Now married and a mother, Trina's life is again thrown into uncertainty when Hitler's Germany announces the "Great Option" in 1939, and communities in South Tyrol are invited to join the Reich and leave Italy. The town splits, and ever-increasing rifts form among its people. Those who choose to stay, like Trina and her family, are seen as traitors and spies; they can no longer leave the house without suffering abuse. Then one day Trina comes home and finds that her daughter is missing... Inspired by the striking image of the belltower rising from Lake Resia, all that remains today of the village of Curon, Marco Balzano has written a poignant novel that beautifully interweaves great moments in history with the lives of everyday people.

Una scrittura agile e leggera, quella di Pagani, non esente da incursioni nella

saggistica e nella riflessione filosofica, in cui si approfondisce la complessa personalità, così diversa ma anche così simile, dei due grandi scrittori, e al contempo si disegna un gustoso affresco della società parigina del primo Novecento. Non a caso, il libro è arricchito in appendice da divertenti 20 profili dei protagonisti (folcloristici "titoli di coda"), ritratti umani e psicologici che ci aiutano a familiarizzare con i celebri artisti attraverso ossessioni, capricci, manie, fissazioni, bizzarre patologie.

This panoramic exploration of French life

between the wars reads like a prequel to Irène Némirovsky's international bestseller *Suite Française*. At the end of the First World War, Bernard Jacquelain returns from the trenches a changed man. Broken by the unspeakable horrors he has witnessed, he becomes addicted to the lure of wealth and success. He wallows in the corruption and excess of post-war Paris, but when his lover abandons him,

Bernard turns to a childhood friend for comfort. For ten years, he lives the good bourgeois life, but when the drums of war begin to sound again, everything around which he has rebuilt himself starts to crumble, and the future—of his marriage and of his country—suddenly becomes terribly uncertain. Written after Némirovsky fled Paris in 1940, just two years before her death, and first published

in France in 1957, *The Fires of Autumn* is a coruscating, tragic novel of war and its aftermath, and of the ugly color it can turn a man's soul.
