Signs in Use is an accessible introduction to the study of semiotics. All organisms, from bees to computer networks, create signs, communicate, and exchange information. The field of semiotics explores the ways in which we use these signs to make inferences about the nature of the world. Signs in Use cuts across different semiotic schools to introduce six basic concepts which present semiotics as a theory and a set of analytical tools: code, sign, discourse, action, text, and culture. Moving from the most simple to the most complex concept, the book gradually widens the semiotic perspective to show how and why semiotics works as it does. Scientific Essay from the year 2014 in the subject Speech Science / Linguistics, , course: The conference "Science Week 2014", MEST, Prishtinë, 2014, language: Albanian, abstract: Një gjuhësinë bashkëkohore, teoria e valencës është njëra nga teoritë themelore shumë e rëndësishme, e cila është përdorur për herë të parë në gjuhësi nga studiuesi frëng Tenieri në veprën Elementet e sintaksës strukturale. Këtë koncept, Tenieri e huazoi nga fjalori teknik i kimisë, duke u nisur nga formula e ujit H2O që tregon se valenca e atomit të oksigjenit është e dyfishtë krahasuar me valencën e hidrogjenit. Që do të thotë se për të formuar një molekulë uji domosdo duhen dy atome oksigjen dhe një atom hidrogjen (për ndryshe nuk do të kemi përtimin e ujit). Ky koncept i përdorur me kuptim metaforik nga Tenieri gjeti zbatim edhe në gjuhësi. Kështu, për të ndërtuar një fjali gramatikore të saktë, b.f. me foljen ngjaj, është e domosdoshme që të plotësohet valenca e foljes, dmth. kjo folje kërkon dy argumente (sipas Tenierit aktant), të cilëve ajo u shkarkon rolet tematike (teoria theta), p.sh.: Agimi i ngjan babait të vet. Te kjo fjali kemi dy argumente: një argument në funksion të kryefjalës (subjektit) dhe një argument të shprehur me sintagmë emërore në rasën dhanore në funksion të kundrinorit të zhdrejtë. Në të kundërtën, fjalia e mësipërme nuk do të jetë gramatikore, si p.sh.: *Agimi ngjan. Kjo fjali është jogramatikore, sepse mbetet pa u plotësuar valenca e foljes me një sintagmë emërore në funksion të kundrinorit të zhdrejtë. Nga kjo analizë vihet në dukje se folja "ngjaj" është folje dyvalente.
