In Auseinandersetzung mit Jon Sobrinos "Christologie aus der Perspektive der Opfer" entwickelt die Autorin einen neuen, biblisch fundierten Ansatz für eine "Ethik für Christen", in dessen Zentrum die praktische Solidarität der Gläubigen mit den Notleidenden steht – ein Ansatz, der angesichts der derzeitigen Probleme in der Welt von höchster Aktualität ist. Anders als universal-christliche Ethiken, die die Perspektive des Glaubens mit der einer "universalen Vernunft" zu verbinden

suchen, bietet eine Ethik aus der Perspektive der Armen und Notleidenden (mit einem dezidiert christlichen Vernunftbegriff) die Chance, auch säkular begründet und in den öffentlichen Diskurs eingebracht zu werden. Durch ein entsprechendes Zeugnis der Christen wird dann auch konkret sichtbar, was sie zur Lösung der großen sozialen, ökonomischen und politischen Probleme unserer Zeit leisten können.

In *Losing Our Virtue: Why the Church Must Recover Its Moral Vision*, theologian David Wells argues that the Church is in danger of losing its moral authority to speak to a culture whose moral fabric is torn.

Although much of the Church has enjoyed success and growth over the past years, Wells laments a "hollowing out of evangelical conviction, a loss of the biblical word in its authoritative function, and an erosion of character to the point that today, no discernible ethical differences are evident in behavior when those claiming to have been reborn and secularists are compared." Wells covers the following in this bold critique: how the theologically emptied spirituality of the church is causing it to lose its moral bearings; an exploration of the wider dynamic at work in contemporary society between license and law; an exposition of the secular notion of salvation as heralded by our most trusted gurus -- advertisers and psychotherapists; a discussion of the contemporary view of the self; how guilt and sin have been replaced by empty psychological shame; an examination of the contradiction between the way we view ourselves in the midst of our own culture and the biblical view of persons as created, moral beings. Can the church still speak effectively to a culture that has become morally unraveled? Wells believes it can.
