Die historische Entwicklung des altsprachlichen Unterrichts in der Bundesrepublik Deutschland wird in dieser auf reichster Quellenbasis erstellten Untersuchung erstmals umfassend dargestellt. Durch die systematische Bestandsaufnahme und Analyse der didaktischen und methodischen Leitlinien dieser Epoche schließt das Werk eine Lücke in der Erforschung der Geschichte des altsprachlichen Unterrichts in Deutschland. Der Band liefert nicht nur wertvolle Erkenntnisse über die Theorie, sondern auch über die Praxis des Latein- und Griechischunterrichts und seine gesellschaftliche Stellung in dieser Zeit. Der umfassende historische Orientierungsrahmen erleichtert das Verständnis der gegenwärtigen Lage der Schulfächer Latein und Griechisch und legt zugleich eine fundierte Basis für die Diskussion um ihre zukünftige Begründung, Gestalt und Weiterentwicklung.

Cicero's speech on behalf of L. Lucinius Murena, newly elected to the consulship of 62 BCE but immediately prosecuted for electoral bribery, is especially famous for its digressions and valuable for its insights into the complex political wrangles of the late 60s. It is, however, a speech more commonly excerpted and cited than read in its entirety, though whether the absence of an English-language commentary is a cause or effect of that situation remains uncertain. In short, a pedagogical commentary on this important and strange speech is long overdue. Distinguished Latinist Elaine Fantham's commentary is noteworthy for its ability to elucidate not only the rhetorical structure of this speech but the rationale behind Cicero's strategic decisions in creating that structure. It also calls attention to the stylistic features like word choice, rhetorical figures, and rhythmic effects that make the speech so effective, and explains with care and precision the political, social, and historical considerations that shaped the prosecution and defense of the somewhat hapless defendant. This commentary includes the kind of grammatical explication required to make its riches accessible to undergraduate students of Latin.

Stories about brothers were central to Romans' public and poetic myth making, to their experience of family life, and to their ideas about intimacy among men. Through the analysis of literary and legal representations of brothers, Cynthia Bannon attempts to re-create the context and contradictions that shaped Roman ideas about brothers. She draws together expressions of brotherly love and rivalry around an idealized notion of fraternity: fraternal pietas--the traditional Roman virtue that combined affection and duty in kinship. Romans believed that the relationship between brothers was especially close since their natural kinship made them nearly alter egos. Because of this special status, the fraternal relationship became a model for Romans of relationships between friends, lovers, and soldiers. The fraternal relationship first took shape at home, where inheritance laws and practices fostered cooperation among brothers in managing family property and caring for relatives. Appeals to fraternal pietas in political rhetoric drew a large audience in the forum, because brothers' devotion symbolized the mos maiorum, the traditional morality that grounded Roman politics and celebrated brothers fighting together on the battlefield. Fraternal pietas and fratricide became powerful metaphors for Romans as they grappled with the experience of recurrent civil war in the late Republic and with the changes brought by empire. Mythological figures like Romulus and Remus epitomized the fraternal symbolism that pervaded Roman society and culture. In *The Brothers of Romulus*, Bannon combines literary criticism with historical legal analysis for a better understanding of Roman conceptions of brotherhood.
