The Lost Steps (Les Pas perdus) is Andri Breton's first collection of critical and polemical essays. Composed between 1917 and 1923, these pieces trace his evolution during the years when he was emerging as a central figure in French (and European) intellectual life. They chronicle his tumultuous passage through the Dada movement, proclaim his explosive views on Modernism and its heroes, and herald the emergence of Surrealism itself. Along the way, we are given Breton's serious commentaries on his Modernist predecessors, Guillaume Apollinaire and Alfred Jarry, followed by his not-so-serious Dada manifestoes. Also included are portraits of Marcel Duchamp, Francis Picabia, and Breton's mysterious friend Jacques Vachi, as well as a crisis-by-crisis account of his dealing with Dada's leader, Tristan Tzara. Finally, Breton offers a first glimpse of Surrealism, the movement that was forever after identified with his name and that stands as a

defining force in twentieth-century aesthetics. Mark Polizzotti, editorial director of David R. Godine, Publisher, is the author of *Revolution of the Mind: The Life of Andri Breton*. He is also the translator of Jean Echenoz's *Double Jeopardy* (Nebraska 1994) and *Cherokee* (Nebraska 1994) and of Andri Breton's *Conversations: The Autobiography of Surrealism*. Mary Ann Caws is Distinguished Professor of French at Hunter College and at the City University of New York. Her most recent work is *Robert Motherwell: What Art Holds*. She is the translator of Andri Breton's *Mad Love* (Nebraska 1987) and *Communicating Vessels* (Nebraska 1990).

Intimate love opens us up to suffering, sacrifice, and loss. Is it always worth the risk? Consulting philosophers, writers, and

poets who draw insights from material life, Diane Enns shines a light on the limits of erotic love, exploring its paradoxes through personal and philosophical reflections. Situating experience at the center of her inquiry, Enns conducts philosophy "by another name," elaborating the ambiguities and risks of love with visceral clarity. *Love in the Dark* claims that intimacy must accept risk as long as love does not destroy the self. Erotic love inspires an inexplicable affirmation of another but can erode autonomy and vulnerability. There is a limit to love, and appreciating it requires a rethinking of love's liberal paradigms, which Enns traces back to the hostility toward the body and eros in Christianity and the Western philosophical tradition. Against a legacy of an abstract and sanitized love, Enns recasts erotic attachment as an event linked to conditional circumstances. The value of love lies in its intensity and depth, and its end does not negate love's truth or significance. Writing in a lyrical, genre-defying style, Enns delineates the paradoxes of love in its relations to lust, abuse, suffering, and grief to reach an account faithful to human experience.

Rosario Tijeras is the violent, violated character at the center of Jorge Franco's study of contrasts, set in self-destructing 1980s Medellín. This catalogue accompanies Carolein Smit's solo exhibition 'L'amour fou'. The show forms a preview of Smit's grand solo exposition, taking place at the Victoria and Albert Museum in London in 2017/2018. It will present the artist's white ceramic reliefs in a classical, Jasperware-like setting, displaying them on light grey-blue walls. Smit's newest project will not go unnoticed. Throughout the history of painting two contrasting artistic approaches can be traced. The first of them is strictly integrating an artwork within the walls, where it is presented, forming an optical illusion, trompe oeil. This originated in fresco painting in antiquity (think of Pompeii) and gained notable popularity in the baroque, when artists strove to trick the human eye. Such creativity continues to this day, and is also visible in contemporary art. In 2014 this could be seen in the works by Jasper Johns and Roy Lichtenstein during the exhibition 'Walls'; at the Castelli Gallery in New York.
