The first nine sections are written with rhymes and passion, with a Romeo and Juliet swing to it. It teaches a lesson that when you cannot freely love someone, you become bound and your heart becomes a slave. Happiness based upon other people's interpretation will never allow you to come "Up from Slavery." Freedom to express oneself and not allow others to dictate your happiness will give you joy and fulfillment. The last section is Part 10, which provides enrichment through poems and wisdom nuggets. The total goal is for people to understand that slavery is not just about Blacks coming over on a ship. It can be applied to any situation where one cannot be who they were born to be.
