besprochenen Themenkomplexe dieses Textes. Anschließend
wird die Wirkung und Rezeption des Römerbriefs nur tangential
angerissen, um einen besseren Eindruck betreffend der

theologischen Bedeutsamkeit dieses Textes einzufangen. Nach
der Grundlagenschaffung wird im zweiten Teil eine
einleitungswissenschaftliche Annäherung an den Römerbrief
gewagt, indem man folgende Punkte anvisiert: Verfasser, Zeit
und Ort der Abfassung, Empfänger, Anlass, Aufbau u.a.m. Der
letzte Punkt dieser Arbeit wird sich mit dem Sinn und Zweck
dieser Schrift beschäftigen und abschließend die Ausarbeitung
der bisher genannten Punkte zusammenfassend konkludieren.
Der Brief des Paulus an die Römer ist ein Buch des Neuen
Testaments und gilt aufgrund seines Inhalts als der wichtigste
Paulusbrief, welches kirchengeschichtlich große Denk- und
Glaubensbewegungen de facto ausgelöst hat. Der Römerbrief
behandelt die prägnantesten Probleme der Glaubenslehre,
angefangen von Heilserlangung durch alttestamentliche
Gesetzestreue und neutestamentlichen Glauben unter der Lupe

des Verhältnisses von Sünde und Gesetz, Verdienst und Gnade, Relation Erbsünde und Sündhaftigkeit bis hin zur Erlösung durch Jesus Christus. Die Gewichtigkeit und die Bandbreite der Sachverhalte, die in diesen Brief lagern, reizte und reizt immer noch die Theologen, diese Schrift immer und immer wieder unter neuen Aspekten und Ansätzen zu untersuchen und zu interpretieren.

Early Christian Rhetoric and 2 Thessalonians A&C Black

As a biblical motif, 'new creation' resonates throughout the pages of the Jewish and Christian scriptures, and occupies a central place in the apostle Paul's vision of the Christian life. Yet the biblical and extra-biblical occurrences of this theme vary widely in meaning, referring to either a new cosmos, a new community, or a new individual. Beginning with the Old Testament and working through the important texts of Second Temple Judaism, Moyer V. Hubbard focuses on how the motif functions in the argument, strategy, and literary structure of these documents, highlighting its role as the solution to the perceived plight. He then explores in detail which senses of the term Paul intends in Galatians 6.15 and 2 Corinthians 5.17, concluding that 'new creation' in Paul's letters describes the Spirit-wrought newness of the person in Christ, and is fundamentally anthropological in orientation.

Studienarbeit aus dem Jahr 2015 im Fachbereich Theologie - Biblische Theologie, Note: 2, Pädagogische Hochschule in Schwäbisch Gmünd, Sprache: Deutsch, Abstract: Diese Arbeit beschäftigt sich mit der Frage, wie wir uns laut Paulus' Galaterbrief unseren Mitmenschen gegenüber zu verhalten haben. Genau diese Fragen gilt es mit den Schülerinnen und Schülern näher zu beleuchten. Die Arbeit beginnt mit einem Übersetzungsvergleich von vier verschiedenen Bibeln. Darauf folgt die Sachklärung, die dreifach untergliedert wurde. Daran schließt eine Textanalyse an, die sich wiederum in drei Unterpunkte gliedert. Dann folgt die Form- und Gattungsanalyse sowie die Vorgeschichte des Textes. Im Anschluss werden traditions-geschichtliche Überlegungen dargelegt und abschließend zusammenfassend interpretiert. Der letzte Teil stellt einen bibeldidaktischen Ausblick dar, der sich mit der Umsetzung von Galater 5,25-6,2 im Unterricht auseinandersetzt.

The tensions and self-contradictions in Paul's statements on the Torah are analysed in this book in detail, which also critically discusses a vast body of scholarly literature on the subject. The contradictions in Paul cannot be explained away, neither by dialectical interpretive devices nor by way of development theories. Rather, they must be taken seriously as real contradictions and as pointers to Paul's unsolved theological problems. Different statements owe their origin largely to different needs, mostly polemical ones, arising in changing situations. "Anyone who has studied Paul knows that probably the most complex problem he develops is his view of the law and its purpose. The beauty of Räisänen's work is that he recognizes and respects this complexity without himself becoming too dense to understand. R. finds that Paul's radicalized, negative criticism of the law is peculiar to him, unparalleled in the NT and without precedent in Jewish thought. With careful, patient examination of various contexts, R. leads his readers to see that Paul has an oscillating, even inconsistent view of the law. Ralph del Colle was born in New York City on October 3, 1954 and was raised in Mineola, Long Island. He attended Xavier High School in Chelsea and received a BA in History and Literature of Religions from New York University, and MDiv, MPhil, and PhD degrees from Union Theological Seminary. Ralph taught for 17 years in the Marquette University Theology Department; prior to that he taught at Barry University, Miami Shores, Florida and at St. Anselm College, Manchester, New Hampshire. Ralph's lively

Christian faith and interest in church unity led to his participation in ecumenical dialogues. He served as a representative to the International Catholic-Pentecostal Dialogue for the Pontifical Council on Christian Unity for 12 years and also served on the Catholic-Reformed Dialogue and Catholic-Evangelical Dialogue, both for the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. He was invited by the Pontifical Council to serve as a representative to the World Council of Churches Assembly in Harare, Zimbabwe in 1998. In 2002-2003, he served as the President of the Society for Pentecostal Studies and in 2003 Ralph received the Archbishop's Vatican II Award. Ralph's scholarly work, especially his work on the Holy Spirit, made significant contributions to the field of Systematic Theology. Ralph died in July of 2012, slightly more than four weeks after he was diagnosed with a rare form of liver cancer. He was fifty-seven.

This book originated in the Donatio Universitatis Carolinae award

and research support that Professor Petr Pokorný received in 2017. It was envisioned, designed, and originally conducted as a project exploring the biblical roots of Christian culture. Experts in various theological and philosophical disciplines, both from the Czech Republic and abroad, were to probe this topic from their particular perspectives. The hoped-for output was to be a coherent collective study of the proposed topic. However, due to the unexpected passing away of Prof. Pokorný in early 2020, the project could not be executed according to the original plan. Rather than a collective monograph, therefore, the present book is a collection of essays that investigate various aspects of the Bible and Christianity in their relation to culture as a broad human phenomenon. The book is divided into two sections. While the first section focuses on particular issues in the Bible, the second addresses historical, philosophical, and cultural developments. As Petr Pokorný was actively and importantly involved in the initial stages of the project, two essays are written by him personally. The whole book, then, is dedicated in his honor.

2 Thessalonians is one of the most enigmatic letters in the New Testament, primarily because of its repeated insistence on its authorship by Paul, coupled with its warnings against forgery of Pauline letters. Modern scholarship has made a number of advances in the study of this letter, but the question of the authorship and purpose remain quite open. Hughes gives a detailed investigation of Graeco-Roman rhetorical traditions and their relationship to letters, and develops a consensus model for

the identification of the various conventional parts of rhetorical discourses. He then offers an interpretation of 2 Thessalonians according to these rhetorical traditions. Given the rhetoric thus identified in the letter, an innovative theory is developed against Paul's authorship of 2 Thessalonians. In his final chapters, he suggests ways in which the pseudo-Pauline letters of the New

Testament witness to a multiplicity of Pauline theologies after the Apostle's death—a diverse and pluriform 'legacy of Paul'.
