movements also begin at this stage Thus, the caregiver is vital in helping the child's development to feel and response Checklists are pre-determined lists that identify knowledge, skills or aptitudes The purpose of observation is to ascertain whether a child can meet these criteria These can be useful if you need to find out something particular and precise
