E infine all'espansione di un regno quasi senza limiti, che lambiva il palazzo imperiale di Pechino e la Via della Seta. Non meno folto di episodi, l'epilogo

della vita di Gengis Khan corrobora i tratti di una personalità insieme monolitica e contraddittoria, che unisce ferocia e saggezza, alta diplomazia e brutalità, amoralismo e improvvise accensioni sentimentali.
