In *The Letters of Mary Penry*, Scott Paul Gordon provides unprecedented access to the intimate world of a Moravian single sister. It also makes an important contribution to the recovery of women's voices in early America, amplifying views on politics, religion, and social networks from a time when few women's perspectives on these subjects have been preserved.
