(7) And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Daily prayer is a key component of our daily life in developing our relationship with God. There is a lot of hand washing happening now. The virus that makes people ill can get on our skin, but warm, soapy water washes it off. Sometimes we do or say things which we shouldn't. They don't make us ill, but they can get in the way of living as Jesus wants us to. When we say sorry to God for the things we shouldn't have done, the psalm writer said that's like

being washed clean and having a fresh start. Wash your hands now. As you do, say "I'm sorry God for... Please forgive me and make me clean again." Many Christians use a special "examen" (a Latin word for "a means of examining").

1. Find a place to be still. Wherever you are, sit comfortably and be still. Relax, but try to be attentive to yourself and to God.
2. Give thanks for the good things of today. Recall one moment you are grateful for from today. Remember how you felt. Notice these feelings and reflect that all good things come from God. Offer your thanks.
3. Let go of things bothering you. What's on your mind at the moment? What is making you feel awkward or anxious? Raise these things to God and ask for the freedom that comes with the presence of the Holy Spirit.
4. Review your day. Try to recall the other events of the day. Reflect on what has happened and how you feel about it. Trust the Holy Spirit to show you the things that are important to think through and the insights that are important to know.
5. Talk with God. Tell God anything that comes to mind - jot it down, speak it out or think it through. God already knows our needs. This is to help us identify what we need to be aware of, let go or recognise.
