ALL literature is, in a sense, autobiographical. Jack London's later works appeared to be so in particular. Certainly he has interwoven his own experiences with those of his hero, Martin Eden. Like Upton Sinclair, Jack London has portrayed in a sensational novel his own early literary struggle. *Martin Eden* is a child of the slums, a sailor rough and blunt, with the delicate soul of a sensitive plant. He save a young bourgeois youth from a band of hoodlums, and is introduced by him to his bourgeois family, including Ruth, his lovely, if bourgeois sister. Ruth, to him, is an angelic vision. Soon the blunt sailor, by a marvelous transformation, is changed into a bookworm. He lusts for knowledge with an almost physical passion. The poet and the

writer who had slumbered in the subconscious caverns of his brain awakens, but one has faith in his genius; his sister looks upon him as a loafer; his sweetheart—for Ruth had been unable to escape the virile magnetism of this sailor-poet—urges him to accept a small clerkship in her father's office. The ravens of despair darken his sky. He attributes his failure to the incapacity of the powers that be in the world of letters; he waxes eloquent when he writes of them. The chief qualification of ninety-nine per cent of all editors, he assures us, is that they have failed as writers. And then suddenly, magically, success beckons. Glorified with the halo of a "best seller," he finds himself courted and dined. Even Ruth is reconciled to him; he, however, sternly rejects her; he declines her with thanks, even as his manuscripts had in the past been returned. The hypocrisy of human nature is revealed to him. There was no justice in this "scheme of things." He was no different from what he had been; his work was no different. He was now sought out, besieged and flattered, not because he was Martin Eden, but because he was famous and wealthy. Indignantly he throws everything, even life, from him. He undertakes a trip to the South Seas; and one night "drops into darkness." Many critics of the time dismissed the story's ending as too pessimistic and that Jack London has never done anything more shocking and unnecessarily "dramatic" than the suicide of his hero. The *Boston Transcript* found it inferior to "Call of the Wild," "The Sea Wolf," and "Before Adam." They went on to say: "He is too violent, too belligerent, too exaggerative, too crude to be an artist in fiction...." The *New York Globe*, predicted that the book would add to the author's reputation, even if it is a little hard on the editors and book reviewers whose daily prayer is: "Dear God delivers us from the temptations of literature, teach us to so live that we may not add to the burden of books which is already greater than the world can bear." It might also be argued that certain distinguished authors, such as Edwin Markham, are also critics. William Marion Reedy is grateful to Jack London for putting "entrails" into our literature. The great romance and fear of bloody revolution--strange blend of idealism and terror--have been superseded by blind faith in the bloodless expansion of human rights and global capitalism. Flying in the face of history, violence is dismissed as rare, immoral, and counterproductive. Arguing against this pervasive wishful

thinking, the distinguished historian Arno J. Mayer revisits the two most tumultuous and influential revolutions of modern times: the French Revolution of 1789 and the Russian Revolution of 1917. Although these two upheavals arose in different environments, they followed similar courses. The thought and language of Enlightenment France were the glories of western civilization; those of tsarist Russia's intelligentsia were on its margins. Both revolutions began as revolts vowed to fight unreason, injustice, and inequality; both swept away old regimes and defied established religions in societies that were 85% peasant and illiterate; both entailed the terrifying return of repressed vengeance. Contrary to prevalent belief, Mayer argues, ideologies and personalities did not control events. Rather, the tide of violence overwhelmed the political actors who assumed power and were rudderless. Even the best plans could not stem the chaos that at once benefited and swallowed them. Mayer argues that we have ignored an essential part of all revolutions: the resistances to revolution, both domestic and foreign, which help fuel the spiral of terror. In his sweeping yet close comparison of the world's two transnational revolutions, Mayer follows their unfolding--from the French Declaration of the Rights of Man and the Bolshevik Declaration of the Rights of the Toiling and Exploited Masses; the escalation of the initial violence into the reign of terror of 1793-95 and of 1918-21; the dismemberment of the hegemonic churches and religion of both societies; the "externalization" of the terror through the Napoleonic wars; and its "internalization" in Soviet Russia in the form of Stalin's "Terror in One Country." Making critical use of theory, old and new, Mayer breaks through unexamined assumptions and prevailing debates about the attributes of these particular revolutions to raise broader and more disturbing questions about the nature of revolutionary violence attending new foundations.

- Charles DICKENS, writer and English journalist, born in 1812 and died in 1870. In 1833, he became a journalist and published news. He writes articles for the biggest dailies of the time. In 1836, he published a monthly soap opera telling The Adventures of Mr. Pickwick, that brings him success. He is, like Balzac in France, one of the pioneers of these publications in episodes that will become very popular in the 19th century. Dickens enjoys immense popularity. He is only 24 years old, but his work touches all generations and all walks of life. He becomes a true idol in his lifetime, in Europe and America. In 1849, Charles Dickens worked on an ambitious and innovative project: he wanted to write a novel that simply follows the daily life of the autobiographical hero: "David Copperfield." Charles Dickens never completely recovered from his injuries. He distributed scholarships, and even founded a house for prostitutes. The author, who has never forgotten the difficult years of his childhood, was an indefatigable defender of the victims of the industrial revolution. Better known for his work than for his social and philanthropic activism, the English author was also a hero in his own way. - A TALE OF TWO CITIES, published in 1859, is a novel by Charles Dickens

In the court, an exhibit against him is presented in the form of a diary kept by Dr. Manette during his incarceration, which he had hidden in his cell. The document reveals that the doctor knew that relatives of Darnay had cruelly murdered a peasant. By reading this letter, the court is unleashed and unanimously votes the execution of Darnay. The lawyer Carton discovers that one of the witnesses against Darnay, at his trial seven years ago, is a spy working in France. He is in the prison where Darnay is incarcerated. Also, he is maneuvering with this spy to visit Darnay in his cell. Once inside, he gives Darnay a drug that plunges him into a deep sleep, swaps his clothes with him and forces the spy to take him out of the compound. The spy managed to get Darnay out of the prison. Once outside, La Manette's car headed back to England. The doctor, Lucie and Mr. Lorry, were also waiting to leave French territory as soon as possible, because all were in danger.
