Teachers College Press La pornografía es la producción y distribución de imágenes sobre actos sexuales, o contenidos sexualmente explícitos cuyo fin es provocar la excitación sexual. Se podría caracterizar

como filmaciones de sexo explícito, con acceso fácil, distribución mediante internet masivamente gratuita, alta calidad, orientadas a generar excitación sexual. Se trata de pornografía distribuida por empresas cuyo único objetivo es el lucro, que han aprovechado las tecnologías de cuarta generación (4G) y que posicionan sus ofertas en todo el mundo. La

gran mayoría de la pornografía presenta una imagen cosificada (mercancías, objetos de placer) y degradada de las mujeres, con una violencia creciente y modelos machistas (sexo en grupo con mujeres sometidas, prácticas de riesgo, violencia). Es prácticamente inevitable que niños/as y adolescentes se expongan a la pornografía en internet: el porno está en todas partes.

En España, un 86,9 % de hombres jóvenes son consumidores habituales, mientras las mujeres jóvenes solo llegan al 54,6 % (Ballester, Orte y Red Jóvenes e Inclusión, 2019). Uno de los peores efectos es la distorsión perceptiva, la formación o deformación de actitudes, especialmente en grandes consumidores de pornografía sin la maduración emocional para comprender lo que ven, maduración que ofrecería una educación sexual adecuada. La percepción distorsionada provoca desconexión moral ("No me importa lo que te pasa") y falta de empatía. Ante esta situación, profesionales de diversas disciplinas vinculados a la Red Jóvenes e Inclusión (de la universidad y del tercer sector) hemos seguido investigando las características de la nueva pornografía, así como los retos educativos y sociales que implica.
