La lectura de la poesía zuritiana siempre ha implicado acercarse también a otro nombre, más lejano en el espacio y en el tiempo, pero grandioso e imprescindible en la tradición literaria, el de Dante Alighieri. Trazando una sólida base que

hunde sus raíces en los orígenes italianos del poeta chileno, la autora desgrana los tópicos literarios pertenecientes al mundo italiano del siglo XIV para estudiar su presencia en la obra de Raúl Zurita. Una vez asentados los temas que forman el tejido poético zuritiano, se acompaña paulatinamente al lector en la búsqueda del elemento dantesco en la poesía de Raúl Zurita, a través de sus poemarios más celebres. La selva oscura que compone el manto infernal de la dictadura evolucionará hacia una idea de salvación que cambia su forma hasta, finalmente, desembocar en la vislumbre de la esperanza. La conformación de la obra zuritiana construida con arquitectura dantesca llevará también a investigar sobre el rol del poeta en sus obras, analizando el periplo y la evolución de la voz lírica bajo un enfoque absolutamente innovador. Un recorrido desde las primeras obras del autor chileno hasta los trabajos actuales, que permiten observar cómo, a través del uso de significantes y significados dantescos, Raúl Zurita consigue construir una poética del

compromiso que se basa en un dogma fundamental: la solución al horror siempre es el amor.

 Imagining the Woman Reader in the Age of Dante brings to light a new character in medieval literature: that of the woman reader and interlocutor. It does so by establishing a dialogue between literary studies, gender studies, the

history of literacy, and the material culture of the book in medieval times. From Guittone d'Arezzo's piercing critic, the 'villainous woman', to the mysterious Lady who bids Guido Cavalcanti to write his grand philosophical song, to Dante's female co-editors in the Vita Nova and his great characters of female readers, such as Francesca and Beatrice in the Comedy, all the way to Boccaccio's overtly female audience, this particular interlocutor appears to be central to the construct of textuality and the construction of literary authority. This volume explores the figure of the woman reader by contextualizing her within the history of female literacy, the material culture of the book, and the ways in which writers and poets of earlier traditions imagined her. It argues that these figures are not mere veneers between a male author and a 'real' male readership, but that, although fictional, they bring several advantages to their vernacular authors, such as orality, the mother tongue, the recollection of the delights of early education, literality, freedom in interpretation, absence of teleology, the

beauties of ornamentation and amplification, a reduced preoccupation with the fixity of the text, the pleasure of making mistakes, dialogue with the other, the extension of desire, original simplicity, and new and more flexible forms of authority.

The essays collected here join in, and contribute to, the current reflection on Dante's vitality today in a critical, multidisciplinary vein. Their intervention comes at a particularly sensitive juncture in the history of Dante's global reception and cultural reuse. Dante today is as alive as ever. A cultural icon no less than a cultural product, Dante's imaginative universe enjoys a pervasive presence in popular culture. The multiformity of approaches represented in the collection matches the variety of the material that is analyzed. The volume documents Dante's presence in genres as different as graphic novels and theater productions, children's literature, advertisements and sci-fi narratives, rock and rap music, video- and boardgames, satirical vignettes and political speeches, school curricula and prison-teaching initiatives. Each chapter combines a focused attention to the specificity

of the body of evidence it treats with best analytical practices. The volume invites collective reflection on the many different rules of engagement with Dante's text.

This Dark Wood is a study of urban alienation in America. In a haunting, modern-gothic style, it

pairs images of people walking alone in nighttime city streets with 90 different English translations, collected by Tonnard, of the famous first lines of Dante's *Inferno*: "Nel mezzo del cammin di nostra vita / mi ritrovai per una selva oscura / ché la diritta via era smarrita." ("In the middle of the journey of our life / I found myself in a dark wood / for the

straight way was lost"). The images were selected from the Joseph Selle collection at the Visual Studies Workshop in Rochester, New York, which contains over a million negatives from a company of street photographers who worked in San Francisco from the 1940s to the 70s. This edition is a reprint of a work originally self-published in 2008.
