Explaining how to combine what he refers to as "the effect" (sharp-focus, high-contrast compositional elements) with "the big blur" (softer edges, lighter values) to create interesting and dynamic artwork. Packed with assignments, detailed demonstrations, and illuminating examples, *Painting by Design* provides big-picture strategies and techniques alongside tips for identifying and addressing specific compositional problems.
