The major difficulty in preparing a book such as this is to invent a notation that is easier to read than the autoharp is to play. The music is supplemented by simple notation which indicates how the autoharp is to be played. The selected 77 tunes lend themselves best to the Autoharp, a unique, distinctly American instrument. They are also well suited for ensembles using other folk instruments in conjunction with the Autoharp, such as guitar, banjo, mandolin, ukulele and dobro. The songs are chorded to accommodate all Autoharp playing styles from simple accompaniment strumming to melody picking. The majority of arrangements are for the 15 chord model, the most commonly used Autoharp. However, in some cases the harmony of the piece requires chords found only on the 21 chord model. This is noted under the title of the song.

Autoharp Owner's Manual Oak Publications

This collection of 35 Celtic tunes represents ten different performance styles from Ireland, Scotland, Wales and Brittany. the majority of these pieces are dance tunes such as the jigs and reels popular at Irish sessions, the informal gatherings of musicians in pubs, community halls, and homes.

harp tunes by famed Irish harpist Turlough O'Carolan as well as other slow airs. All of the pieces in this book have been arranged to be played on any standard 15 or 21-bar chromatic autoharp in either melodic or rhythmic (backup) style. A melody line with suggested chord accompaniment is included so other instrumentalists can easily join in. the book's companion CD includes performances of all 35 selections, ably illustrating the rhythmic and stylistic nuances of this engaging music.
