Large dam construction has significant environmental and social impacts at different scales. As the largest developing country in the world, China has built about half of the world’s large dams, and more are expected to be built over the next two decades to meet the country’s rapidly growing demand for energy. This book summarizes and updates information about the history, distribution, functions, and impacts of large dams, both globally and at China’s national level. It then addresses the environmental and social-economic impacts of large dams in China with particular emphasis on the impacts of large dams on relocated people and associated compensation policies. Lastly, it introduces an integrated ecological and socio-economic study conducted in areas affected by dams along the Upper Mekong River, China. This book has the following three goals. The first goal is to summarize and update information on large dams globally and at China’s national level (Ch. 2). We examine large dam problems from different perspectives, ranging from their spatial and temporal distributions and their environmental and social impacts, to discussions and debates centered on them. We also incorporate the results of an empirical investigation of the environmental and socio-economic impacts of large dams on the Upper Mekong River, China, and draw conclusions out of the analysis (Chs.3 & 4). Our second goal is to provide an analysis framework to help understand the environmental and social-economic impacts of dam construction and the resulting environmental degradations and social inequities at different scales (Chs.3 & 4), as well as to offer recommendations for mitigating these impacts within China’s socio-political context (Ch. 5). The significant environmental effects resulting from dam construction include damage to ecological integrity and loss of biological diversity. The most significant social consequences brought by dam projects are their negative impacts on relocated people. Our analysis framework provides approaches to help comprehensively understand these impacts. Our third goal is to provide clues and suggestions for further studies of large dam problems both globally and in China (Ch. 5). The construction of large dams is proceeding rapidly in different parts of the world despite the heated debates on whether they should be built at all. The decision-making process related to building large dams involves considerations of economic viability, environmental sustainability, and social equity. Therefore, interdisciplinary collaborations are required in large dam research and development projects in order to reconcile the interests of different stakeholders and avoid harming ecosystems, biodiversity, and human welfare. Overall, we hope our book facilitates future examinations of large dams by providing summaries of existing data and research related to large dams, and offering a framework for better understanding and analyzing their environmental and social impacts.

A survey study exploring the attributions of dangerousness and avoidance from people with severe mental illness was carried out. The study employed opportunity sampling and sixty students (m=30; f=30) half of which were students of Psychology and the other half were students of MBA. The

students' familiarity with severe mental illness, the perception of dangerousness and the desire to avoid from persons with severe mental illness were gathered via a self-administered electronic survey. More females than males showed a heightened level of fear and avoidance from persons with severe mental illness. However, students with a psychology background showed more desire for social inclusion and lower perception of dangerousness than the MBA. Similarly, students with the high level of familiarity showed less fear and more tolerance towards persons with severe mental illness than students with low level of familiarity, which supported the earlier findings.

Construction industry is characterized as not only physically but also mentally demanding with industry specific characteristics such as heavy workload, long working hours, work-family conflicts etc. However, inadequate research has been done to address the mental health aspect of the construction industry, where attention has been dominantly focused on physical health. On the other hand, the variance in terms of labor demands also distinguishes the construction industry from the rest and results in the second highest temporary employment rate based on the report from The Center for Construction Research and Training (CPWR) in 2015. Since the temporary construction workers are reported to have been earning less income, receiving less benefits and experiencing higher job insecurity, this study looks into the mental health of this disadvantaged population. In the literature review, characteristics of the overall as well as the temporary construction workforce are identified. The measurement of the mental health performance is determined to be the Kessler Index (K6) and the odds of serious mental illness (SMI). Meanwhile, the variables which are considered to be associated with mental health are also teased out from previous studies, which consist of demographics, annual income, housing status, health status and others. The two data sources identified are the Medical Expenditure Survey (MEPS) and Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System-Washington State (BRFSS-WA). Due to the information availability of the variables of interest, two different models are proposed, with one at the national level based on MEPS and one at the Washington State level based on BRFSS-WA. At the national level, the comparisons are made among the non-construction, permanent construction and temporary construction workforce while at the Washington State level, the comparison is made between non-construction and construction workers. Descriptive analysis is performed on all the variables to create a general profile at the national level and the state level. Linear regression and logistic regression are also performed in order to test the significance of the difference at the two levels. Based on the analysis, it is found that, at the national level, permanent construction workers have significantly lower mean K6 score than the non-construction workers. Temporary construction workers are found to have lower mean K6 score than non-construction workers and higher mean K6 score than permanent construction workers, but neither of the difference is significant. As for the odds of SMI, permanent construction workers tend to have significantly lower odds than the non-construction workers. Temporary construction workers tend to have higher odds than the other two groups, but neither of the difference is significant. At the Washington State level, construction workers are found to have lower mean K6 score and odds of SMI, but neither of them is significant. In addition, the significance of the covariates are also discussed in the analysis. Moreover, the lessons learnt from the data handling process are discussed and recommendations are listed out. Limitations of this study and suggestions for future research are also presented at the end.
