A P45 has 4 parts (Part 1, Part 1A, Part 2 and Part 3) Your employer sends details for Part 1 to HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) and gives you the other parts You give Part 2 and 3 to your new

P45 Form Definition

A P45 is also issued by a pension provider when one claims their pension savings held with the pension provider When one takes out their entire pension fund as a lump sum, a part of this amount will be considered taxable earnings and this will need to be reported to HMRC

A P45 is a form that an employer gives to their employee when they leave a job It's a way of passing tax and payroll information from the old employer to the new employer and the employee for their own tax records

You may need to use the information in a P45 to fill out a tax return, if you are sent one If you're not working, you'll need your P45 to claim tax refunds and social welfare benefits Your P45 is also important for making sure you are not charged too much tax when withdrawing money from your pension
