Cold-blooded crime record: New York US crime documentary breaks three pending cases HBO's "The Jinx" is a documentary describing the murder of three of the eldest sons of New York's wealthy family, Durst. In the documentary interview with Durst himself, the family members of the victims, police detectives, lawyers, etc., The director was finally surprised that

the truth of the three outstanding cases slowly emerged during the filming process and was finally confirmed. In the finale of the documentary "The Life and Death of Robert Durst", Durst not only acknowledged killing the confidant Berman but also killed at least two other people, including the original McCormack. Durst is the eldest son of New York's real estate entrepreneur Durst and grew up in Scarsdale, New York. Durst married McCormack in 1973, and McCormack disappeared in 1982. Durst was suspected of killing his wife. Durst then gave the entire group to his brother and family to enjoy a leisurely life of \$ 2 million a year, and from this step he became a serial killer's derailed life. Like the horns of a detective film, wherever Durst goes, someone is

missing or dead. Durst was arrested on March 14, 2015 for first-degree murder, and his new trial is scheduled for January 13, 2020. Prosecutors don't plan to sentence the 76-year-old Durst, who is weak because of cancer and other health problems, to death. First murder (original disappearance) Durst's first wife, McCormack, returned to her New York apartment shared with her husband on January 31, 1982, and no one saw her again. Five days later, Durst called the police, claiming that after the two had a dispute that night, he thought his wife had left the house temporarily for the sake of calm, and did not call the police until the fifth day. The police originally determined that ordinary couples were arguing. It was not until McCormack evaporated and there was evidence of

domestic violence that the police launched an in-depth investigation. The investigation found that Durst repeated the testimony of "Memory of the Day", differing from the lawyer's statement, and suspected that Durst had killed his wife. The police have not been able to gather sufficient evidence. In addition, the medical school where McCormack worked claimed that McCormack had called the dean for leave the day after his disappearance, the police could not make Durst specific crimes. McCormack was born on June 15, 1952, the fifth and the youngest child in the family. She graduated from Long Island New Hyde Park High School and is a dental hygienist. In 1971, McCormack met Durst. After two dates, Durst moved to Vermont with her, and they ran a health

food store called All Good Things. Durst's father was unhappy and wanted him to focus on the real estate business. Durst refused to move to Manhattan with McCormack. On April 12, 1973, when Durst was 30 years old, he married McCormack, McCormack studied at the Einstein Medical School in the Bronx and received a degree in nursing in 1978. In early January 1982, McCormack was treated for facial bruising at a Bronx hospital. She told her friend that she had suffered domestic violence from Durst. Due to domestic violence, McCormack filed for a divorce and asked for \$ 250,000 in settlement fees. Durst refused to give money, cancelled her credit card, stopped paying her medical school tuition, and deleted her name from their joint bank account.

McCormack plans to uncover illegal transactions within the Durst family real estate company in an effort to pressure Durst. Durst's father warned his son that his wife "is a threat to the family business and needs to deal with it." On January 31, 1982, McCormack disappeared. Eight years later, McCormack's body was not found. The Court of Appeal ruled that her death date was January 31, 1982. In 1990, Durst filed for divorce, claiming to have abandoned his spouse. Second Murder (Confidant Murder Case) In 2000, the police resumed investigating the disappearance of McCormack, and McCormack's friends told the police that Durst had a confidant, Berman. Police believe she may be the breach in this case and will tell Durst's secrets. On

December 23, 2000, one week before police and Berman's interview, someone sent a notebook to the Beverly Hills Police Station with an address and a capitalized word: "Body". The address belongs to Berman. She was shot dead at home the same day the police received the "death note" and the body was found the next day. On Christmas Eve, in the Benedict Canyon area of Los Angeles, a neighbor of Berman found that the back door of her house was half open, and the beagle ran outside, thinking that there was a suspicious report. Los Angeles police arrived and found Berman's body. There was no sign of forced entry. The killer left no fingerprints or DNA. Berman sustained gunshot wounds to the head and back, and was caused by firing a 9mm pistol to

the back of his head. Forensic experts believed she was killed a day ago. The police believe that the killer notified the police by means of a "death note", hoping that Berman's body would be found sooner, so as not to be rotten and unattended, confirming the close relationship between the killer and the deceased. Berman is a loyal spokesperson and media consultant for Durst. In 1982, when Durst's wife, McCormack, disappeared, Berman produced a certificate of absence for Durst. On the day of Berman's funeral, Durst did not attend and was missing, making him even more suspicious, but like the first murder, the police had no evidence to order Durst to commit a specific crime. Third Murder (Kill Neighbors) When Berman was shot, New

York prosecutors were unable to prosecute Durst, who lost track of the case. In January 2001, Durst appeared again in front of the media and was arrested for murdering neighbor Blake and discarding it. Prosecutors said that after reports of McCormack's disappearance began to appear in New York newspapers, Durst killed Berman for a blowout and fled to a coastal town in Texas. He rented an apartment for \$ 300 a month, posing as an older, dumb woman. Prosecutors believe that his neighbor, Blake, knew his identity, and Durst was murderous. Durst killed neighbor Blake, dismembered the body and discarded it in the bay. The police recovered some of the wreckage wrapped in plastic bags on the sea, and found weapons such as pistols and saws

on Durst vehicles. In 2003, Durst admitted in court that the body was divided into three parts, wrapped carefully in plastic bags and thrown into Galveston Bay. Durst said that he was arguing with Blake, Blake pointed at him with guns, they were fighting for guns, they both fell to the ground, the sound of gunfire sounded, Blake was shot dead. He told the jury that the body was dismantled and abandoned in the sea because he thought no one would think it was self-defense, so he did not call the police. Durst, defended by a powerful lawyers group, claimed to be justified, claimed to have been attacked by a mentally disturbed neighbor, accidentally shot and killed the neighbor, and the jury rendered a acquittal. In 2002, Durst was remanded in prison in

Galveston, Texas for the Black murder. The Los Angeles Police issued a court order requesting Durst to provide handwritten samples for comparison with capital letters on the 2000 Death Note. Durst's investigation into deadlocks in Los Angeles and New York after his acquittal of self-defense homicide was released in 2003. In 2010, Durst offered to the producers of "The Jinx" to assist them in shooting documentaries about his own cases. The documentary film staggers Durst's self-defense shots, his meticulous offensive and defensive tactics with defense lawyers make him acquit. The editing method of the director and the film crew, in addition to the cold-blooded murder case, is also a tender part, such as Durst's childhood witness of his mother's

suicide, his relationship with his wife, and his close years with trust and even worshipped his close friend Berman, etc. . The audience wasn't sure if Durst was really murderous or even sympathized with him. During the filming of the documentary, when the producer looked at the information provided by Durst, he found that a letter Durst wrote to Berman in 1999, with the address on the envelope, spelled Beverly Hills as "Beverley." The "Death Note" received by the police in 2000 had the same address error. When this key evidence was found, the documentary production was over, director Jericho bluntly stated that Durst is likely to be a murderer, worried about the safety of the team, but decided to make a final blow. Prior to the final episode, the director and

production team conducted a meticulous sandbox deduction to guide Durst into the trap. The director took out a letter from Durst to Berman and a "death note", and asked Durst if he had killed Berman, Durst firmly denied. After the conversation ended, Durst went to the bathroom. He didn't turn off the radio, whispered to himself, and said in a calm and creepy tone: "It's a disaster ... I have a hard time answering this question. What happened? Of course, kill them all. " The production team did not surrender the "confession recording" as soon as possible. Two years later, before the documentary was about to be released, the evidence was handed over to the police and attracted public attention. The director said that the recording was discovered only after more than two

years of shooting a documentary. It is unknown whether the director designed the recording trap because he was familiar with Durst's habit of talking. On March 14, 2015, Durst was arrested at a hotel in New Orleans and charged with murdering Berman. He has been detained without bail and has hydrocephalus. On March 17, Durst was suspected of possessing a firearm and was transferred from the Orleans Parish Criminal Court to the Orleans Parish Prison after his trial in New Orleans. On October 26, 2018, Judge Wyndham of the Los Angeles County High Court ordered the trial of Durst's friend Berman, who murdered him in 2000. Prosecutors allege that Durst killed Berman because of fears that Berman would disclose it to the authorities.

McCormack, who had disappeared in 1982, the first wife of Durst, was killed and abandoned by him. On December 24, 2019, Durst's chief defense attorney, De Guilin, acknowledged that the "death note" mailed to the police in 2000 was written by Durst. The defense lawyer emphasized: "The note indicates that the person who mailed knew that there was a corpse in the room and not murdered Berman." Durst's new trial is scheduled for January 13, 2020, and it remains to be seen whether he can escape as before.
