Relato sobre el delirante proceso abierto
contra Allen Ginsberg El 25 de agosto de
1968 tuvo lugar en Chicago la
Convención del Partido Demócrata.
Cinco mil personas entre anarquistas,
pacifistas, hippies, comunistas,
exponentes de la nueva Izquierda,
radicales, militantes negros, llegaron a la
ciudad y se acamparon en el Lincoln
Park. Junto a Ginsberg estaban Norman
Mailer, William Burroughs, Jean Genet.

La respuesta de las Fuerzas Armadas,
inmediata, masiva y violenta hizo
historia. Soldados, agentes de policía,
detectives del FBI, un total de 24.000
hombres se lanzaron en una despiadada
caza al hombre. Aunque un informe
oficial estableció que la violencia fue
provocada por las fuerzas del orden, los
organizadores de las protestas de
Chicago fueron procesados y
condenados. Delante de los jueces
desfilaron las personalidades más
representativas de la nueva cultura
norteamericana: entre ellos por supuesto
estaba Allen Ginsberg. Durante el
interrogatorio y el contrainterrogatorio,
el autor de Aullido salmodió y recitó sus
poemas, indiferente a toda clase de
burlas por parte de la corte y
determinado a explicar las razones
profundas de aquellas protestas.

del interrogatorio con un prólogo de
Fernanda Pivano y la crónica de la
comparecencia de Ginsberg delante de
los jueces que se publicó en The New
York Review of Books en 1970 firmada
por Jason Epstein, editor, escritor,

SOBRE EL AUTOR Allen Ginsberg
(1926-1997) nació en Newark, New
Jersey. En 1944, en New York, su vida se
cruza con la de Jack Kerouac y William
Burroughs, encuentro que marcará y
anticipará el movimiento de la Beat
Generation. En 1956 publica Aullido, uno
de los textos poéticos más leído del siglo
XX. EXTRACTO Primer interrogatorio de
Weinglass, abogado de la defensa. P:
¿Podría por favor indicarnos su nombre
completo? R: Allen Ginsberg. P: ¿A qué
se dedica? R: Soy poeta... P: ¿Ha
estudiado en alguna ocasión en el
extranjero? R: Sí... En la India y en Japón.
P: ¿Puede precisarles al Tribunal y al
jurado en qué... consistieron dichos

estudios? R: Mantra yoga, ejercicios de meditación, cánticos, aprender a sosegar la mente permaneciendo en silencio, ejercicios de respiración para sosegar cuerpo y mente..., pero sobre todo una rama llamada mantra yoga, que es un tipo de yoga que entraña oraciones y cánticos.

Habla del alcoholismo y la lucha por salir de él; también aborda los mitos –literarios, artísticos– que lo envuelven, conectando genialidad con autodestrucción ética.
