The Wizard of Oz, Gigi, Top Hat, High Society - some of the most popular movie musicals ever made were written by Broadway songwriters. *The Sound of Music, Chicago, West Side Story, The Music Man, Grease* - some of the other most popular movie musicals were adaptations of Broadway shows. From the

very first talkies to the present, Broadway's composers and lyricists have given much of their best work to the movies - but with varying results. In the 1930s, Rodgers and Hart's *Love Me Tonight*, with Maurice Chevalier and Jeanette MacDonald at their sexiest, is a masterpiece of fairytale sophistication. But *Hallelujah, I'm a Bum*, an Al Jolson vehicle about tramps in Central Park, is one of the outstanding flops, partly because Rodgers and Hart wrote it as a kind of opera that is spoken instead of sung. Or take the big films based on Broadway shows in the 1960s. After *The Sound of Music*, Hollywood sought to fill the screen with lots of scenery, lots of drama, and lots of Julie Andrews. But *Camelot* and *Hello, Dolly!* had too much scenery, *Paint Your Wagon* was the hippie musical, and *Song of Norway* was simply loony. Even Julie Andrews couldn't save the Broadway bio film called *Star!*, all about the adventures of Gertrude Lawrence.
