Although comprising over half million serving more than five million students, Christian school teachers are traditionally underrepresented in educational research. The purpose of this research is to ascertain whether Christian school teachers applying self-directed learning (SDL) skills to participate in online teacher networks facilitate their professional development (PD). Their participation in online teacher networks can motivate them to persist in teaching as self-selected PD is tailored to meet specific needs in practice. PD activities online through teacher networks are cost-effective, timesaving, and build social capital. Online PD can supplement teachers' informal learning activities and extend traditional PD provided by schools. Analysis of survey data from faculty at Vacaville Christian School used the bivariate Pearson coefficient correlation. Findings showed a statistically significant result: a moderate positive relationship between applying self-directed skills in online learning spaces like teacher networks and Christian school teachers' PD. The study concludes that PD is a shared responsibility by both teachers and school leaders. Practice implications such as using their self-directed learning skills to engage in formal post-graduate studies and developing personal and professional goals can advance teachers' efforts to improve

practice. Policy implications include Christian schools applying for the Every Student Succeeds Act funds to deliver PD in varied formats to teachers, seek accreditation, and validate teacher time spent in online learning spaces as continuing education units. Further studies are needed to identify specific SDL skills and how Christian school teachers can develop them to facilitate their online PD.
