Concerto for Eb Alto Saxophone and Orchestra Greenwood (E.B. Marks). Commissioned by a consortium of saxophonists led by Christopher Creviston, Bolcom's "celebratory" Concerto has become an instant staple of the repertory. In three movements entitled "Lively, with humor," "Serenade," and "Shimmy," Bolcom explores blues and jazz like never before, utilizing the band instrumentation to punctuate various popular styles. The piano reduction is eminently playable as a recital piece.

It is a unique reference source for saxophone performers, teachers, and students. Since the 1970s, a veritable explosion of saxophone recital music has taken place. Saxophone Recital Music includes the vast majority of recordings on 33 1/3 rpm records, cassette tapes, and compact discs through early 1993.

"Alexander Glazunov's Concerto in E-flat Major for Alto Saxophone and String Orchestra of 1934, written for virtuoso saxophonist Sigurd M. Rascher, is one of the most significant works within the saxophone literature. This document provides historical details of Glazunov's work, including a discussion of the circumstances leading to its composition, while comparing the editions currently available to define a clearer understanding of the work and the composer's intentions.

Concerto en mi bémol, pour saxophone alto et orchestre à cordes

A diverse and timeless collection of 66 famous chorales arranged for concert band by Frank Erickson. The chorales are all arranged in four parts (SATB) and, in addition to full band, are playable by a wide variety of smaller groups, from quartet on up. Besides being an excellent warm-up tool, 66 Festive and Famous Chorales for Band provides a perfect opportunity to work on musicianship, phrasing, balance and intonation.

Concerto for alto saxophone solo or trumpet solo, with nine instruments

Composed during the years 2003-2004 by David Bilskemper, this piece, the saxophone concerto, was completed during a life transition. Long awaiting publication, the piece as a full score edition is now available in this format. The saxophone writing in the piece pushes limits and boundaries on the instrument to the maximum potential almost of what was thought possible in terms of range and duration. Early on the prospects for a chamber orchestra version were forsaken in favor of this instrumentation- the composition for full orchestra and saxophone.
