Ce troisième volume propose une réflexion "transversale" sur les principes directeurs, le fonctionnement, les moyens et les buts du régime napoléonien, et une véritable plongée dans la France impériale, qui couvrait la France actuelle, mais aussi la Belgique, la Hollande, le Luxembourg, une partie de l'Allemagne, de l'Italie et des régions balkaniques. Après la description de l'Etat napoléonien, de sa place au coeur de l'organisation sociale et de ses principes de fonctionnement, sont esquissés les contours de la société, de son socle paysan à son économie, en passant par sa structure et le positionnement fluctuant des grands courants politiques.
