En esta tercera edición, ampliada y revisada, de «La eficacia del optimismo» se da información biográfica sobre

Charles Dickens; se ofrece luego un comentario global a su obra; y a continuación, por orden cronológico, se presentan reseñas de sus novelas largas, de sus libros de viajes y de muchos de sus relatos cortos, muy apoyadas en observaciones y comentarios de G. K. Chesterton. Esto responde a que, junto con «Formas de la felicidad», dedicado a varias obras y autores decimonónicos, y «Una espléndida sinceridad», un panorama sobre la figura y las obras de Robert Louis Stevenson, este libro tiene como uno de sus objetivos ampliar la información que dio el autor sobre Chesterton en «Gramática de la gratitud» y poner así más de relieve su gran categoría como crítico literario. «La eficacia del optimismo» no pretende ser

un libro exhaustivo sobre Dickens pero sí una certera y sintética guía de lectura de sus obras, en la que se ponga de manifiesto cuáles son las más importantes y atractivas, y en la que, además, quede patente la capacidad de transformación que tiene la visión alegre, combativa y esperanzada del mundo y de la gente que Dickens y Chesterton compartían.

En esta oportunidad, la “Serie de los dos siglos” recupera otro material valioso de la crítica literaria nacional. Esta obra de Adolfo Prieto es testimonio de sus permanentes preocupaciones y de su modo de entender la historia de la literatura, siempre enlazada con la historia social; su análisis, en este caso, propone que las formas de dominación

económica, que originan categorías conceptuales como “desarrollo” y “subdesarrollo”, se replican en las representaciones culturales y traducen esas relaciones asimétricas; de ese modo por ejemplo las potencias económicas convertidas también en potencias culturales, condicionan la producción literaria nacional y su percepción por parte de los intelectuales.

language of twenty-one countries,} and it is set fair to overtake English by the year 2000 in numbers 2 of native speakers. This vast geographical and political diversity ensures that Spanish is a good deal less unified than French, German or even English, the latter more or less internationally standardized according to either American or British norms. Until the 1960s, the criteria of internationally correct Spanish were dictated by the Real Academia Espanola, but the prestige of this institution has now sunk so low that its most solemn decrees are hardly taken seriously - witness the fate of the spelling reforms listed in the *Nuevas normas de prosodia y ortograjia*, which were supposed to come into force in all Spanish-speaking countries in 1959 and, nearly forty years

later, are still selectively ignored by publishers and literate persons everywhere. The fact is that in Spanish 'correctness' is nowadays decided, as it is in all living languages, by the consensus of native speakers; but consensus about linguistic usage is obviously difficult to achieve between more than twenty independent, widely scattered and sometimes mutually hostile countries. Peninsular Spanish is itself in flux.

Charles Bukowski, poet, novelist, short-story writer, journalist, and cult figure of the dissident and rebellious was born in Germany in 1920 and died in the USA in 1994. During his life he was hailed as

"laureate of American lowlife" by Time magazine literary critic Adam Kirsch of The New Yorker wrote: "The secret of Bukowski's appeal...(is that) he combines the confessional poet's promise of intimacy with the largertan-life aplomb of a pulp-fiction hero." Bukowski was one of the most unconventional writers and cultural critics of the 20th century. He lived an unorthodox, idiosyncratic life and wrote in a style that was unique—one that is impossible to classify or categorize. His work was at times cynical or humorous, but was always brilliant and challenging. His life and work are distinguished not only by a remarkable talent for words, but also by his rejection of the dominant social and cultural values of American society. Bukowski began writing at the

age of forty and published forty-five books, six of them novels. He is also considered one of the great literary voices of Los Angeles. In Bukowski For Beginners, playwright Carlos Polimeni evaluates the life and literary achievements of the cult writer whose voice of dissidence and discontent is still heard and appreciated by readers worldwide.
