Mozart's Piano Concertos, especially those composed during the years 1784-'91, are still held in high esteem, two centuries later, by both amateur music-lovers and professional musicians. Strangely enough, only very few comprehensive studies exist on this remarkable section of Mozart's output. The present study, first published in German in a slightly abridged form, deals with Mozart's evolution as a composer of piano concertos; sheds light on the connections between the

concertos and other fields of creative activity, as well as on those with other composers of his time. Finally, attention is paid to problems of performance practice. The author, born in 1914, emeritus professor of Utrecht University and former chairman of the Zentralinstitut für Mozart-Forschung, Salzburg, has been involved with the subject of Mozart's concertos for about 60 years.

Camille Saint-Saëns began as a child prodigy and was acclaimed in his

lifetime as the incarnation of French genius. His was one of the longest careers in musical history, stretching from the traditions of Beethoven to the innovations of the twentieth century, including one of the earliest film scores.

As a virtuoso pianist he achieved international fame, while Liszt

proclaimed him the world's greatest organist. A prolific composer, there is

much more to him than his best-known work, the witty Carnival of the Animals,

of which he forbade performances in his lifetime. Among his most notable

achievements are the opera Samson et Delila and the Organ Symphony, while

the Danse Macabre, second piano concerto and first cello concerto remain

much loved.As a young man, he

supported the 'new music' of Liszt,

Wagner and Berlioz and introduced the symphonic poem into French music. He

championed an up-and-coming

generation of French composers, most notably Fauré, and played a unique part

in transforming French taste from grand opera and operetta to the classical forms

of symphony and chamber music, at the same time reviving interest in the music

of Bach and Rameau.His personal life

was combative, tragic and surrounded

by rumour: as a boy during the

Revolution of 1848, serving as a National Guard in the war of 1870, and eventually

becoming something of an icon of the

Third Republic, used in diplomacy as a

turbulent period when music, no less

than politics, was undergoing

sensational and often stormy change.

Chopin's E minor and F minor Piano Concertos played a vital role in his

career as a composer-pianist. Praised for their originality and genius when he performed them, the concertos later attracted censure for ostensible weaknesses in form, development and orchestration. They also suffered at the hands of editors and performers, all the while remaining enormously popular. This handbook re-evaluates the concertos against the traditions that shaped them so that their many outstanding qualities can be fully appreciated. It describes their genesis, Chopin's own performances and his use of them as a teacher. A survey of their critical, editorial and performance histories follows, in preparation for an analytical 're-enactment' of the music - that is, a narrative account of the concertos as embodied in sound, rather than in the score. The final chapter investigates Chopin's enigmatic 'third concerto', the *Allegro de concert*.

The third volume of the annotated selected letters of composer Benjamin Britten covers the years 1946-51, during which he wrote many of his best-known works, founded and developed the English Opera Group and the Aldeburgh Festival, and toured widely in Europe and the United States as a pianist and conductor. Correspondents include librettists Ronald Duncan (*The Rape of Lucretia*), Eric Crozier (*Albert Herring*, *Saint Nicolas*, *The Little Sweep*) and E. M. Forster (*Billy Budd*); conductor Ernest Ansermet and composer Lennox Berkeley; publishers Ralph Hawkes and Erwin Stein of Boosey & Hawkes; and the celebrated tenor Peter Pears, Britten's partner.
