 the crime genre in India. The writings reflect their understandings
 of criminality and guilt, as well as negotiations with colonial law
 and policing. Further, through a selection of cases in which
 women make an appearance either as victims or offenders, (or
 sometimes as both,) this book sheds light on the hidden gendered
 experiences of the time, often missing in mainstream Bangla
 literature. Combining a love for suspense with critical readings of
 a cultural phenomenon, this book will be of much interest to
