Annotation. Formerly known by its subtitle "Internationale Zeitschriftenschau für Bibelwissenschaft und Grenzgebiete", the International Review of Biblical Studies has served the scholarly community ever since its inception in the early

1950's. Each annual volume includes approximately 2,000 abstracts and summaries of articles and books that deal with the Bible and related literature, including the Dead Sea Scrolls, Pseudepigrapha, Non-canonical gospels, and ancient Near Eastern writings. The abstracts - which may be in English, German, or French - are arranged thematically under headings such as e.g. "Genesis", "Matthew", "Greek language", "text and textual criticism", "exegetical methods and approaches", "biblical theology", "social and religious institutions", "biblical personalities", "history of Israel and early Judaism", and so on. The articles and books that are abstracted and reviewed are collected annually by an

international team of collaborators from over 300 of the most important periodicals and book series in the fields covered.

Donald Mitchell's second book on the life and work of Gustav Mahler focuses principally on Mahler's first settings of Wunderhorn texts, volumes I and II of the Lieder und Gesaenge, his first song-cycle, the Lieder eines fahrenden Gesellen, the later, orchestral settings of Wunderhorn poems. The central section of the book explores the extraordinary and often eccentric chronology of the First, Second and Third Symphonies' composition, an often minute exploration which reveals the interpenetration of song and symphony in this period of Mahler's art, emphasizes the significance for these works of imagery drawn from the Wunderhorn anthology, and calls attention to the ambiguous position occupied by much of Mahler's music at this time, suspended as it was between the rival claims - and forms - of symphony

and symphonic poem. The final section of the book not only looks at the Fourth Symphony as the final, perhaps most perfect, flowering of Mahler's Wunderhorn symphonies, but also investigates such fascinating topics as the relationship between Mahler and Berlioz, Mahler's addiction to the E flat clarinet, and the influence of Bach on Mahler's later masterpieces.

Shakespeare's works occupy a prismatic and complex position in world culture: they straddle both the high and the low, the national and the foreign, literature and theatre. The Second World War presents a fascinating case study of this phenomenon: most, if not all, of its combatants have laid claim to Shakespeare and have called upon his work to convey their society's self-image. In wartime, such claims frequently brought to the fore a crisis of cultural identity and of competing ownership of this 'universal' author. Despite this, the role of Shakespeare during the Second World War has not yet been examined or documented in any depth. Shakespeare and the Second World War provides the first sustained international, collaborative incursion into this terrain. The essays demonstrate how the wide variety of ways in which Shakespeare has been recycled, reviewed, and reinterpreted from 1939-1945 are both illuminated by and continue to illuminate the War today.

 This volume presents a close reading of instances of Shakespearean quotations, allusions, imagery and rhetoric found in Karl Marx's collected works and letters, which provides evidence that Shakespeare's writings exerted a formative influence on Marx and the development of his work. Through a methodology of intertextual and interlingual close-reading, this study provides evidence of the extent to which Shakespeare influenced Marx and to which Marxism has Shakespearean roots. As a child, Marx was home-schooled in Ludwig von Westphalen's little academy, as it were, which was Shakespeare- and literary-focused. The group included von Westphalen's daughter, who later became Marx's wife, Jenny. The influence of Shakespeare in Marx's writings shows up as early as his school essays and love letters. He modelled his early journalism partly on ideas and rhetoric found in Shakespeare's plays. Each turn in the development of Marx's thought—from Romantic to Left Hegelian and then to Communist—is

achieved in part through his use of literature, especially Shakespeare. Marx's mature texts on history, politics and economics—including the famous first volume of *Das Kapital*—are laden with Shakespearean allusions and quotations. Marx's engagement with Shakespeare resulted in the development of a framework of characters and imagery he used to stand for and anchor the different concepts in his political critique. Marx's prose style uses a conceit in which politics are depicted as performative. Later, the Marx family—Marx, Jenny and their children—was central in the late-19th-century revival of Shakespeare on the London stage, and in the growth of academic Shakespeare scholarship. Through providing evidence for a formative role of Shakespeare in the development of Marxism, the present study suggests a formative role for literature in the history of ideas.

 Shakespeare's Folktales Sources argues that seven plays—The Taming of the Shrew, Titus Andronicus, The Merry Wives of Windsor, The Merchant of Venice, All's Well that Ends Well, Measure for Measure, and Cymbeline—derive one or more of their plots directly from folktales. In most cases, scholars have accepted one literary version of the folktale as a source. Recognizing that the same story has circulated orally and

occurs in other medieval and early modern written versions allows for new readings of the plays. By acknowledging that a play's source story circulated in multiple forms, we can see how the playwright was engaging his audience on common ground, retelling a story that may have been familiar to many of them, even the illiterate. We can also view the folktale play as a Shakespearean genre, defined by source as the chronicle histories are, that spans and traces the course of Shakespeare's career. The fact that Shakespeare reworked folktales so frequently also changes the way we see the history of the literary folk- or fairy-tale, which is usually thought to bypass England and move from Italian novella collections to eighteenth-century French salons. Mit "In Tasmanien" macht Nicholas Shakespeare wie vor ihm Bruce Chatwin mit seinem berühmten Patagonien-Porträt die Erkundung einer Landschaft und ihrer Geschichte zum literarischen Ereignis. Im Zentrum stehen dabei die abenteuerlichen Leben zweier ungleicher Partner: Der eine ist Anthony Fenn Kemp, der an einem stürmischen Novembermorgen des Jahres 1804 an der Ostküste Tasmaniens, das damals noch Van-Diemens-Land hieß, unter den verwunderten Blicken der Aborigines an Land waten: Kemp ist Sohn eines bekannten Wein- und Tabakhändlers, hat in London ein üppiges Erbe durchgebracht und sich kurzerhand nach Australien in die britische Strafkolonie "under Down Under" abgesetzt. Der andere, sein Schwager und Chef der gemeinsamen Firma Potter & Kemp, William Potter, sitzt derweil daheim in England. Potter

ist ein vorsichtiger, penibler Buchhalter und damit das genaue Gegenteil seines durch Tasmanien vagabundierenden Kompagnons, der sich immer wieder Geld schicken lässt, zwielichtige Geschäfte tätigt und monatelang als "Vater Tasmaniens" die halbe Insel befehligt. Kemp, der sich gern als "George Washington von Van-Diemens-Land" huldigen ließ, war nicht nur einer der ersten Kolonisten des Territoriums - er ist direkter Vorfahr von Nicholas Shakespeare und in dessen Familie das wahrscheinlich schwärzeste Schaf. Indem Nicholas Shakespeare über die Abenteuer seiner Vorfahren Potter und Kemp berichtet, erzählt er zugleich die raue Geschichte einer Insel am Ende der Welt, die den Briten einst als Kerker diente und die heute ein beliebtes Reiseziel ist.
