Wir haben alle die gleichen Rechte und den Anspruch darauf, dass der Staat sie umsetzt", so das Deutsche Institut für Menschenrechte. Die Behindertenrechtskonvention unterstreicht den menschenrechtlichen Status von Inklusion. Menschenrechte gewährleisten den Schutz vor jeglicher Form von Diskriminierung, zum Beispiel aufgrund einer Behinderung, der Hautfarbe, der sozialen, ökonomischen, ethnisch-nationalen Herkunft, der Geschlechtsidentität oder der sexuellen Orientierung. Der Inklusionsbegriff bezieht sich also nicht mehr nur auf die Belange von Menschen mit Behinderungen – auch wenn für diese Gruppe die BRK eine besondere Errungenschaft darstellt: Sie hat erfolgreich Rechte und Ansprüche eingefordert, von denen sie lange ausgeschlossen war. Mit dieser erweiterten Perspektive erfährt das Verständnis von "Behinderung" einen Paradigmenwechsel: Behinderung ist kein zuschreibbares Merkmal, sondern bezieht sich auf Barrieren – baulich, strukturell und in den Köpfen, durch
