Jean-Nicolas-Louis Durand (1760-1834) regarded the *Précis of the Lectures on Architecture* (1802-5) and its companion volume, the *Graphic Portion* (1821), as both a basic course for future civil engineers and a treatise. Focusing the practice of architecture on utilitarian and economic values, he assailed the rationale behind classical architectural training: beauty, proportionality, and symbolism. His formal systematization of plans, elevations, and sections transformed architectural design into a selective modular typology in which symmetry and simple geometrical forms prevailed. His emphasis on pragmatic values, to the exclusion of metaphysical concerns, represented architecture as a closed system that subjected its own formal language to logical processes. Now published in English for the first

time, the *Précis* and the *Graphic Portion* are classics of architectural education.
