Interspersed throughout the text are useful addenda and excursions, which provide further detailed treatment of specific topics. / An unusual feature of *God, Creation, and Revelation* is Jewett's inclusion of eight sermons by Dr. Marguerite Shuster, a former student of his. Believing that theology and preaching must go together, Jewett has strategically placed these sermons throughout the book as creative examples of how to preach Christian doctrines.
