It is also important to adhere to effective seed storage procedures to keep the seed viable. We can go on and on about how well informed you need to be before you start saving seeds, but we can't; hence the reason why this book, *Saving Seeds Handbook*, was written, to provide you with virtually all you need to save seeds successfully.
