### Woher kommt der Hass? Macmillan

The concept of »postmigration« has recently gained importance in the context of European societies' obsession with migration and integration along with emerging new forms of exclusion and nationalisms. This book introduces ongoing debates on the developing concept of »postmigration« and how it can be applied to arts and culture. While the concept has mainly gained traction in the cultural scene in Berlin, Germany, the contributions expand the field of study by attending to cultural expressions in literature, theatre, film, and art across various European societies, such as the United Kingdom, France, Finland, Denmark, and Germany. By doing so, the contributions highlight this concept's potential and show how it can offer new perspectives on transformations caused by migration.

In this astonishing debut, Emma Glass articulates the unspeakable with breathtaking verve. Intensely physical, with rhythmic, visceral prose, Peach marks the arrival of a visionary new voice.

The book juxtaposes key texts from Foucault and Habermas; it then adds a set of reactions and commentaries by theorists who have taken up the two alternative approaches to power and critique. Which paradigm of critique—Foucault's or Habermas's—is philosophically and practically superior, especially with regard to the nature and role of power in contemporary society? In shaping this collection, Michael Kelly has sought to address this question in relation to the ethical, political, and social theory of the past two decades. Michel Foucault and Jurgen Habermas had only just begun to come to terms with one another's work when Foucault died in 1984; they had even discussed the possibility of a formal debate on "Enlightenment" in the neutral arena of the United States. In the decade since, Habermas and his supporters have continued to respond to Foucault in various ways, but Foucault's followers have not shown as strong an inclination to keep up his side of the dialogue. For this reason an invaluable exchange on the nature and limits of philosophy in the present age has never achieved its full potential. In this anthology Michael Kelly recasts the debate in

Im 2022 erschienenen 1. Teil habe ich mich mit der deutschen Vereinigung, dem Demokratieverständnis vieler Menschen und der Entstehung von Rechtsextremismus auseinandergesetzt und dabei belegt, dass viele Mythen in der deutschen Gesellschaft zu Politik- und Demokratieverdrossenheit führen, was wiederum rechtsextreme Einstellungen fördert. Im vorliegenden 2. Teil baue ich auf diese Erkenntnisse auf und weise nach, dass viele "Errungenschaften" der DDR nicht existierten oder mit dem von den DDR-Bürger\*innen gewählten Beitritt zur Bundesrepublik hinfällig wurden. Ich befasse mich ausführlich mit der Idee des Sozialismus, der insbesondere in Ostdeutschland noch immer viele Anhänger hat, obwohl Millionen Menschen in Unfreiheit leben mussten oder ihr Leben verloren haben. Insbesondere die Rolle der SED in der DDR und wird ausführlich dargestellt, ebenso die Transformation der Partei zur PDS und die Rolle der wichtigsten Akteure in diesem Prozess. Anschließend untersuche ich Gemeinsamkeiten und Differenzen der "Fluchtwellen" aus der DDR von 1989/90 und dem Nahen Osten der Jahre 2015/16 und erläutere die politischen Entwicklungen und Stimmungen in Deutschland infolge dieser Zuwanderungsprozesse. Detective Bob Fraser and Jack Whitehead, a reporter at the Post, however, have other things on their minds—mainly the fact that someone is murdering prostitutes. The killer is quickly dubbed the "Yorkshire Ripper" and each man, on their own, works tirelessly to catch him. But their investigations turn grisly as they each engage in affairs with the prostitutes they are supposedly protecting. As an increasingly polarized America fights over the legacy of racism, Susan Neiman, author of the contemporary philosophical classic *Evil in Modern Thought*, asks what we can learn from the Germans about confronting the evils of the past. In the wake of white nationalist attacks, the ongoing debate over reparations, and the controversy surrounding Confederate monuments and the contested memories they evoke, Susan Neiman's *Learning from the Germans* delivers an urgently needed perspective on how a country can come to terms with its historical wrongdoings. Neiman is a white woman who came of age in the civil rights-era South and a Jewish woman who has spent much of her adult life in Berlin. In the United States, she interviews James Meredith about his battle for equality in Mississippi and

Bryan Stevenson about his monument to the victims of lynching, as well as lesser-known social justice activists in the South, to provide a compelling picture of the work contemporary Americans are doing to confront our violent history. In clear and gripping prose, Neiman urges us to consider the nuanced forms that evil can assume, so that we can recognize and avoid them in the future.

Die Aktualität von Theodor W. Adornos Radiobeitrag "Erziehung nach Auschwitz" erweist sich darin, gegenwärtige gesellschaftliche Verhältnisse und Transformationen analytisch auf-zuschließen und diese unter einen Aufklärungsanspruch zu

stellen. Der erstmals 1966 ausgestrahlte Vortrag besaß eine große Strahlkraft für die Pädagogik und Erziehungswissenschaft, da er die Erziehung und Bildung zur Demokratie mit der Aufgabe verknüpfte, sich mit den Verbrechen des Nationalsozialismus auseinanderzusetzen - und zu verstehen, wodurch diese möglich wurden. Adornos Diktum, dass jene Bedingungen, die Auschwitz möglich machten, fortbestehen, bildet für den vorliegenden Band einen wichtigen Ausgangspunkt: Wie steht es um eine Erziehung und Bildung zur Demokratie im Lichte von Rechtspopulismus, Antisemitismus, eines weltumspannenden Kapitalismus sowie von Ungleichheitsverhältnissen in globalisierten Kontexten? Zu fragen ist auch, wie sich eine Erziehung nach Auschwitz womöglich wandelt bzw. wandeln muss unter Maßgabe von Transnationalisierung, Digitalisierung und Klimawandel. Welche pädagogischen Konsequenzen und praxisbezogenen Übersetzungen können aus diesen Reflexionen gewonnen werden? Dieser Band, der zum 50. Todestag von Theodor W. Adorno erscheint, versammelt Beiträge aus verschiedenen erziehungswissenschaftlichen Teildisziplinen und Diskursen, um die genannten Fragen im Sinne einer doppelten Vergewisserung - Gesellschaftsanalyse und Aufklärungsanspruch - zu bearbeiten. Die Herausgeber\*innen forschen und lehren an der Goethe-Universität Frankfurt am Main.

Across Eastern Germany, where political allegiances are shifting to the right, the wolf is increasingly seen as a trespasser and threat to the local way of life. Styled by populist right-wing actors as an 'invasive species', the wolf evokes and resonates with anti-immigration sentiments and widespread fears of demographic catastrophe. To many people in Eastern Germany, the immigrant and the wolf are an indistinguishable problem that nobody in

power is doing anything about. In this account of Eastern German agitation of wolves and migrants, Eastern German hunters, farmers, rioters and self-appointed 'saviours of the nation', Pates and Leser move beyond stereotypic representations of 'the East' and shine a light on the complexities of post-socialist life and losses. As nationalist parties are on the rise across Europe, *The wolves are coming back* offers an insight into the rise of the far right in Germany. The nationalist Alternative for Germany

represents the third-largest party in the German federal parliament, with representation in the vast majority of German states. They draw much of their support from the 'post-traumatic places' in Eastern Germany, regions structured by realities of disownment, disenfranchisement and a lack of democratic infrastructure. Pates and Leser provide an account of the societal roots of a new group of radical right parties, whose existence and success we always assumed to be impossible.
