of an effective national STD prevention and control strategy and provides direction for an appropriate response to the epidemic. Recommendations for improving public awareness and education, reaching women and adolescents, integrating public health programs, training health care professionals, modifying messages from the mass media, and supporting future research are included. The book documents the epidemiological dimensions and the economic and social costs of STDs, describing them as "a secret epidemic" with tremendous consequences. The committee frankly discusses the confusing and often hypocritical nature of how Americans deal with issues regarding sexuality--the conflicting messages conveyed in the mass media, the reluctance to promote condom use, the controversy over sex education for teenagers, and the issue of personal blame. In 1904, the first Scandinavian settlers moved onto the Spirit Lake Dakota Indian Reservation. These land-hungry immigrants struggled against severe poverty, often becoming the sharecropping tenants of Dakota landowners. Yet the homesteaders' impoverishment did not impede their quest to acquire Indian land, and by 1929 Scandinavians owned more reservation acreage than their Dakota neighbors. Norwegian homesteader Helena Haugen Kanten put it plainly: "We stole the land from the Indians." With this largely unknown story at its center, *Encounter on the Great Plains* brings together two dominant processes in American history: the unceasing migration of newcomers to North America, and the protracted dispossession of indigenous peoples who inhabited the continent. Drawing on fifteen years of archival research and 130 oral histories, Karen V. Hansen explores the epic issues of co-existence between settlers and Indians and the effect of racial hierarchies, both legal and cultural, on marginalized peoples. Hansen offers a wealth of intimate detail about daily lives and community events, showing how both Dakotas and Scandinavians resisted assimilation and used their rights as new citizens to combat attacks on their cultures. In this flowing narrative, women emerge as resourceful agents of their own economic interests. Dakota women gained autonomy in the use of their allotments, while Scandinavian women staked and "proved up" their own claims. Hansen chronicles the intertwined stories of Dakotas and immigrants--women and men, farmers, domestic servants, and day laborers. Their shared struggles reveal efforts to maintain a language, sustain a culture, and navigate their complex ties to more than one nation. The history of the American West cannot be told without these voices: their long connections, intermittent conflicts, and profound influence over one another defy easy

categorization and provide a new perspective on the processes of immigration and land taking.

Chapters 3 and 4 detail the effects of teacher expectations in various contexts including grade level, subject, and time of year, and present a thorough research study of teacher-student interactions. The last two chapters outline strategies for change and implications for training and staff development exploring Afro-centric responses, parent involvement, relevant research findings, and various staff development competencies for policy development and prejudice reduction. The detailed introductory essay, the seven tables and five figures, and an appendix that provides supplemental information describing the research study methodology in Chapter 4 complete this valuable volume. Scholars and students of Afro-American and African Studies, as well as educational administrators and practitioners will find this work both timely and provocative.

"Illness Dance" takes place in the Sacred Valley of the Incas in the Peruvian highlands in 1978. The story begins with a 1533 account of a child sacrifice high on

Ampato Volcano in the Andes that took place shortly after the Conquistadors sacked the Inca capital at Cuzco. Three hundred years later two young students arrive at the same location and accidentally witness the execution of two men by members of the Shining Path. The students investigate a stone box where the victims were digging and recover a rolled textile containing amulets, charms, and a quipu (counting device made of rope used by the Incas). They join their professor (Shelly Kelly) in Lima to turn in their find and tour Lima museums before leaving to conduct fieldwork at the ancient Inca fortress of Ollantaytambo. During the tour they meet two treasure hunters posing as archaeologists who want to join the crew in hopes of finding the fabled Golden Chain of the Incas made of two tons of gold. The younger treasure hunter is kidnapped by the Shining Path in Lima and his father and uncle-venture capitalists in New York who bankrolled the treasure hunters-come to rescue him. The uncle carrying the ransom money is murdered in a church in Pisac; the treasure hunter's other partner is drawn and quartered by the Shining Path; and the remaining treasure hunter (von Dinnegar) is nabbed by the Path, but escapes. He is recaptured and trepanated by a cult who believe a huaca (spirit) resides inside his skull. Local villagers descended from the Incas begin roaming the countryside speaking in strange voices-a phenomenon known as the Illness Dance in the 1500s-brought on by fear of the Conquistadors (and in this case, the Shining Path). Shelly's professor-friend (Lynn Hurley) mysteriously disappears in Ollantaytambo. During the ensuing investigation Shelly discovers a full-sized underground replica of the Temple of the Sun in Cuzco hidden under the streets of Ollantaytambo. It is populated by a group of Chosen Women and the mummies of four long-dead Inca kings. They also find the other half of the Ampato Volcano quipu. By combining the two quipu segments they decipher encoded clues that lead them to the Golden Chain-and to Shelly's near demise.

Feed Harper Collins
