Sam Easterson's videos allow us to see from the viewpoint of an aardvark, a tarantula, a tumbleweed; Motohiko Odani's films show a surrealistic genetically modified bestiary. *Becoming Animal* documents these works with eye-popping full-color images, taking us on a visual journey through an unknown world.
